CME Opportunity Offered at Annual Family Medicine Workshop

(COLUMBUS, Ohio)—The Ohio Academy of Family Physicians (OAFP) has announced continuing medical education (CME) topics for its 2008 Family Medicine Workshop, scheduled for Saturday-Sunday, Jan. 12-13, and Jan. 26-27, 2008, at Crowne Plaza Hotel, Dublin, Ohio.

From case history analysis to interactive sessions with each instructor, the workshop will offer technical theory and current practice methods on the following topics:

- Allergy/Immunology
- Pediatric Infectious Disease
- Dermatology
- Pulmonary
- Hematology/Oncology
- Pediatric Neurology
- Cardiovascular

Registration for the seminar is open to family physicians, primary care physicians and residents. Each two-day, weekend course costs \$195 for OAFP members, \$235 for other primary care physicians and \$85 for residents. Costs for each course include dinner on Saturday and lunch on Sunday.

Since 1963, the Family Medicine Workshop has provided information on diagnostic techniques, advanced technical theory, current research, problem-solving methods and management techniques within the core content areas of family medicine. Each two-day, weekend course provides plenty of time for case discussion and interaction with the faculty. At-home study prior to the course is an additional feature of this unique educational experience as case studies are sent to each registered participant.

The Family Medicine Workshop has been reviewed and is acceptable for up to 22 Prescribed CME credits by the American Academy of Family Physicians (AAFP). This program has also been reviewed by the American Osteopathic Association (AOA) and is acceptable for up to 22 AOA Category 2-A credits.
