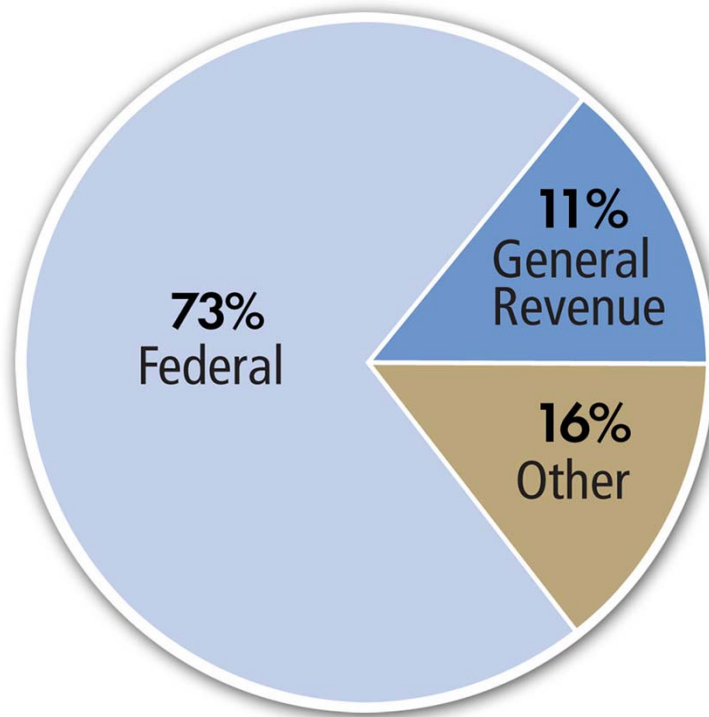


ODH's Organization

ODH Strategic Goals

- Prevent chronic, environmental, genetic and infectious diseases.
- Promote good health to reduce chronic disease and enhance quality of life.
- Assure quality and safety of health care services.
- Assure public health preparedness and security.
- Eliminate health disparities in Ohio's minority and underserved communities.

Medicaid Health Home

For Medicaid, the PCMH model of care is called the Health Home and its core components are from Section 2703 of the Affordable Care Act (ACA).

- Comprehensive care management;
- Care coordination and health promotion;
- Comprehensive transitional care, including appropriate follow-up, from inpatient to other settings;
- Patient and family support (including authorized representatives);
- Referral to community and social support services, if relevant; and
- Use of health information technology to link services, as feasible and appropriate.



Medicaid Health Home

- \$47 million over biennium (2012-2013)
- ORC Sec. 3701.032 in budget bill: ODH Director may adopt rules defining Health Homes.
- Adds another payer for PCMH reimbursement/sustainability.
