Quadruple Aim







A Multidimensional Framework for Patient and Family Engagement in Health and Health Care



Survey



About the Survey

- Purpose is to inform the AAFP of the prevalence of this issue among our members and the patients they serve
- Identifies
 - family physicians' perceptions of SDOH
 - activities of primary care clinics (screening, referral, advocacy)
 - barriers and needs

Results (Available at www.aafp.org/everyone)

- Four in 10 indicated this is either an 'essential' or 'high' priority issue
- Nearly 60% are screening patients for SDOH and making referrals to social service resources
- Family physicians are establishing high impact partnerships to address the issue with the help of:
 - community-based organizations (35%)
 - health insurers (13%)
 - philanthropic organizations (15%)

SDOH - Three tools to screen for social determinants of health

- ▶ 1. The National Association of Community Health Centers' Protocol for Responding to and Assessing Patients' Assets, Risks, and Experiences tool(www.nachc.org) (PRAPARE) includes 15 core questions and 5 supplemental questions. The data can be directly uploaded into many electronic health records as structured data.
- ▶ 2. The American Academy of Family Physicians offers a social determinants of health screening tool, available in short- and long-form in English and Spanish, as part of The EveryONE Project. The short-form includes 11 questions.
- 3. The Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services Accountable Health Communities' 10-question Health-Related Social Needs Screening Tool(innovation.cms.gov)

- Financial







Lives saved - thousands

60 tons of medicines, medical supplies & equipment to Puerto Rico mostly on private planes, airline donations, & purchasing on island. On the receiving end were hospitals, clinics, cancer centers, shelters, senior citizens, and group homes for children in 70 of the 78 municipalities of Puerto Rico, including the offshore islands of Vieques and Culebra.




