





## Home vs Office vs Telehealth for Medication Enhanced Recovery (HOMER)

**HOMER is a new national study** comparing office- vs home- vs telehealth-based induction methods for medication assisted treatment (MAT) in patients with opioid use disorder (OUD).

The HOMER study is a partnership between the **State Network of Colorado Ambulatory Practices and Partners (SNOCAP)** and the **American Academy of Family Physician's National Research Network (AAFP NRN)**.

We are conducting this study to better understand if one induction method works better and to determine if certain patient and practice characteristics make patients better candidates for one method over the other. Results will help fill a gap in the evidence around effectively treating OUD with MAT in primary care settings.

HOMER will work with 100 primary care practices across the country and up to 20 patients per practice. Please let us know if you are interested!

## **Practices**

- Must be willing to administer MAT to study patients in an office-based, telehealth, and/or homebased setting (dependent upon patient randomization).
- Will receive up to \$10,300 to enroll up to 20 patients over 12 months and maintain a tracking log.
- Will receive access to MAT resources, including treatment protocols, forms, and guidelines.

## Participants will be patients

- Identified by their primary care team as having OUD and opting to receive MAT with buprenorphine.
- Randomized to begin treatment with either an office (observed) or home (unobserved) induction (or possibly a synchronous telehealth option).
- Practice recruitment in wrapping up in January 2021 so join now!
