### About the Expert Trainer:

**Gokce Ergun Ph.D.** is a clinical faculty, a licensed clinical psychologist in the state of Ohio and a former associate professor at the School of Professional Psychology at Wright State University, Dayton, Ohio. After years of serving as a faculty member at WSU, Dr. Ergun currently resides in Istanbul, Turkey and works in private practice while she is still the grant recipient from Ohio Department of Mental Health and Addictions to promote screening, diagnosis and treatment of fetal alcohol spectrum disorders (FASD). Dr. Ergun has a bachelor's degree in Psychology and master's degree in Clinical Psychology from Bogazici University, Istanbul, Turkey. She completed her Ph.D. in School Psychology at Central Michigan University, Michigan, USA. Following an APA approved internship at the University of Minnesota Medical School and Children's Hospital, she started her career as a faculty member. Clinical interests and expertise include infant and toddler assessment, pediatric neuropsychological assessment, psycho-educational assessment, school psychology, school consultation, treatment of externalizing and internalizing disorders of childhood, parent training, assessment and treatment of developmental disabilities (Autism Spectrum Disorder, Fetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorder), and prenatal drug and alcohol exposure. Dr. Ergun has extensive training and experience in assessment of neurodevelopmental disabilities, specifically Fetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorders. She has conducted numerous FASD evaluations, sat in IEP meetings to advocate for children and families impacted by FASD and provided consultation to families. Dr. Ergun also provided several trainings to mental health agencies, trained staff at various organizations in the areas of identification, screening, diagnosis, treatment and prevention of FASD. She is also a member of American Psychological Association (including Division 40), and National Association of School Psychologists.
